Commentaries on the Rule Of St. Benedict

Several Oblates have asked for suggestions on commentaries on the *Rule of St. Benedict (RB)*. The list is too exhaustive to list here. Commentaries can be broken into three primary

groups; devotional, line by line (exegesis), and a combination of the two. But before listing various commentaries, please remember that there are also quite a number of books that teach the *Rule* and are a bit more palatable for the average Oblate. The works of Michael Casey, Demetrius Dumm, Joan Chittister, and Basil Pennington, to name just a few, teach the *RB* in terms that synthesize the



concepts brought out in the commentaries but do not overwhelm the reader. Also, before moving on to a exegesis commentary it is strongly recommended that the Oblate consider purchasing:

Fry, Timothy, ed. *RB 1980, The Rule of St. Benedict: 1980.* Collegeville, MN: The Liturgical Press, 1981. ISBN 0-8146-1220-2.

This is the primary copy of the *RB* that is used in the Monastery. The book provides an excellent history of the *RB*

and monasticism, scriptural indexes in the RB a thematic index and a general index in general.

Of the devotional commentaries of the *RB*, Oblates might consider some of the following works:
