


Oblate Program at Belmont Abbey, NC June, 2018

Raymond Geyer, OSB, served for over 16 years as the Director of Oblates and is still remembered by many of us. So it seems appropriate the room be named the "Geyer Room" in memory of these two modest monks who, together, gave over 132 years of service to the Monastic Community here at Belmont Abbey.


This will be the last meeting for the year. Meetings will resume

suddenly wake up and find that the joy of God is everywhere, and they are able to exult in the virtues and goodness of others more than ever they could have done in their own. They are so dazzled by the reflection of God in the souls of the men they live with that they no longer have any power to condemn anything they see in another. Even in the greatest sinners they can see virtues and goodness that no one else can find. As for themselves, if they still consider themselves, they no longer dare to compare themselves with others. The idea has now become unthinkable. But it is no longer a source of suffering and lamentation: they have finally reached the point where they take their own insignificance for granted. They are no longer interested in their external selves.
